Updated Instructions for Authors

General

Typescripts should be typed in English, double spaced and single-sided on A4 sheets and should be numbered beginning with the title page. The first page of an article should contain (1) the title of the paper, (2) the surname(s) and initial(s) and address(es) of the author(s), (3) the e-mail of the author to whom correspondence and proofs should be sent, (4) an abstract of 100–200 words, and (5) keywords.

Along with normal papers, the authors can submit brief communications, their size should not exceed 4 pages of the Journal "T and A".

Text

The electronic version of the manuscript (preferably typed in Word 2007 or higher) is sent by e-mail to the editorial office: **tanda@itp.nsc.ru**. Units of measurements, abbreviations, and symbols should follow the International System of Units (SI). Headings and subheadings for different sections of the paper (e.g., Introduction, Methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusion) should be clearly indicated. Only equations and formulas that are referenced in the text should be numbered consecutively with arabic numerals in parentheses on the right-hand side of the page. Such formulas should be typed in the formula editor MathType version 5.0 or higher or Microsoft Equation 3.0 or higher. Single variables and small simple formulas in lines of text should be better, whenever it is possible, to type without a formula editor, using only the Times and/or Symbol fonts. If the authors wish to present the lists of Nomenclature (separating Greek symbols and Indices), they must be incorporated in the paper text before the list of References.

Tables and figures

Tables should be given short informative titles and numbered consecutively in arabic numerals. Lettering on figures should be proportional to the size of the figure to ensure legibility after reduction. All figures and tables should be cited consecutively in the text.

It is necessary that the figures, the number of which should be logically explainable, were presented in good quality. All illustrations should be made with a resolution of 600 dpi. For grayscale and full color images, JPG and PNG formats are desirable. It is advisable not to use inscriptions on halftone illustrations, except for numbers and dimensions. Graphic illustrations can be performed in BMP, GIF, TIF, PNG or CDR formats, with the latter being preferred.

Review articles are an exception. In such articles, references are not numbered, but in the text are indicated in parentheses with the names of the authors and the year of publication. Moreover, in the case of one, two or three authors, all surnames are given, for example, (Brown, Smith, 2007), and in the case of four or more authors, only the first author, for example, (Smith et al., 2008). In the list of references, references are arranged in alphabetical order by the surname of the first author (without numbering). In this case, the year of publication is indicated between the surnames of the authors and the title of the publication.

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
